BUILDING PERMIT & INSPECTION UTILIZATION REPORT OCTOBER 1, 2021 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2022 FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022

Pursuant to Florida Statute 553.80, by December 31 of each year, the governing body of a local government that provides a schedule of fees shall create a building permit and inspection utilization report and post the report on its website. The information in the report shall be derived from relevant information available in the most recently completed financial audit.

After December 31 of each year, the governing body of a local government that provides a schedule of fees shall update its building permit and inspection utilization report before making any adjustments to the fee schedule.

The Village of Tequesta's fiscal year begins on October 1 and ends on September 30. The below information is derived between that period for the referenced fiscal year:

1. Direct and indirect costs incurred by the local government to enforce the Florida Building Code, including costs related to:

- a. Personnel services costs, including salary and related employee benefit costs incurred by the local government to enforce the Florida Building Code.
