3. *Provide a description of the implementation of each recommendation or action item in the action plan, including a statement on how the project was implemented or not implemented during the previous year:*

The LMS Prioritized Project List (PPL) dated Fall 2025 contains 136 projects ranked from 1 through 136. The Village of Tequesta has five flood related projects on the Fall 2025 PPL:

PPL Rank Fall 2025	Project Title	2026 Status Update
84	Public Safety Building Emergency Generator	Installation of a standby generator for the Public Safety facility remains challenging due to funding limitations. Staff continues to maintain existing emergency power capabilities and evaluate phased or alternative solutions as feasible within the approved operating budget to support emergency response and continuity of operations.
103	Village Hall Emergency Generator	Project implementation is currently on hold due to bids received exceeding the available and estimated budget.
113	Public Safety Building Wind Mitigation Project	Implementation of planned wind mitigation improvements to the Public Safety Building remains challenging due to funding constraints and competing capital priorities. In the interim, staff continues to maintain the facility and implement incremental repairs and upgrades as needed through the annually approved operating budget, supporting continuity of operations and hazard resilience objectives.
114	Village Hall Wind Mitigation Project	Planned wind mitigation improvements for Village Hall have not yet been fully implemented due to funding constraints. Staff continues to maintain the building and address priority repairs and system upgrades as conditions warrant under the approved operating budget, supporting facility resilience and operational continuity.

129	Tequesta Drive Bridge Improvements Project	Currently out for Bid – under cone of silence

5. *What are recommendations for new projects or revised recommendations?*

It is recommended that we continue performing routine maintenance and smaller, targeted replacements as needed to keep facilities in good working condition. For larger, full-scale wind mitigation improvements, I suggest implementing them in phases over time. This approach will allow the Village to better manage budget impacts by spreading costs across multiple fiscal years while still making steady progress toward strengthening our facilities.
